ROY YOUNG BAND were here in March with YES, and received a standing ovation. Since then they have signed a record deal and have a single currently receiving massive airplay and selling well. A really excellent rock band.

FILMS - Cartoons, a comedy, a full length cinema type feature film, a Cuban short and maybe more.

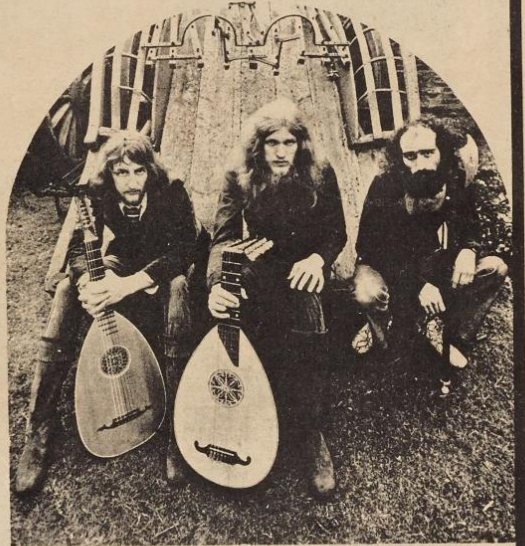
DISCO - the Mushroom Disco, running all night in J Lounge.
